

Lead the efficiency drive

We are currently looking for organisations to partner with *HSJ* to produce our February 2014, *HSJ* Efficiency supplement.

Published early next year, David Nicholson will no longer be chief executive of NHS England, yet the efficiency challenge he set will remain and the 2015 deadline to make £20bn in savings will loom large.

Given that many of the easy wins have now been found, the NHS must now look to the private sector.

This *HSJ* Efficiency Supplement will look at how the *private sector* can help the NHS to meet the efficiency challenge.

Divided into key sections and designed in partnership with sponsors, it will explore areas such as:

- How technology can help the health service operate more efficiently
- How clinicians are being engaged in the issue of cost savings
- How the specific challenges with A&E are being confronted
- How the move to care closer to home is being supported
- How excellent patient care is being delivered alongside efficiency improvements
